2.14 Significant Activities and Contribution by IQAC:
1. Academic:-
(a) There are sustained efforts to improve the academic performance of weak students. Extra classes are conducted for their better results. More emphasis is given or clearing the fundamentals of the subjects. Faculty members are encouraged to give FAQ to students of their respective subjects. With all these efforts result is better than the university average.
(b) Faculty members are trained on new technologies like DB2 & Rational SEED by IBM as a college initiative to train the trainer.
(c) Industrial visits in and around NCR are organized. Some of the companies visited are Huawei, Network Bulls, Maruti, Yakult Milk, etc

2. Development/Improvement in Students Performance:-

- (a) The students are counselled from time to time. Two class counsellors are appointed per class. Final year students are associated with a faculty mentors for proper guidance and better counselling.
- (b) There is a consistent effort to improve the performance of students in the University Examination
- (c) In addition, the consistent efforts are made to improve the performance in placements. The efforts are also made to improve the soft skills and communication skills of the students so that they are able to face interviews.
- (d) The students are encouraged to participate in National & International Seminars.
- (e) In order to encourage research work in the college, a highly qualified and experienced faculty is appointed as Advisor Research & Training. College started its own research journal which encourages faculty members to pursue research and publish their research work.
- (f) Alumni connect program are conducted by college on regular basis to guide the students differences between present education system and actual demands of Industries
- (g) Regular online practice tests are conducted for the student's preparation for placement.

3. New Facilities Created:-

- (a) The labs are being set up for Civil Engineering and Electronics and Computer Science branch.
- (b) LCD projectors are installed in all the classrooms
- (c) <u>Library:</u> Thousands of Books and e-journals are made available in library, separate computers are installed for online access.

4. Projects:-

Project is the most important part in any professional course. To motivate the students in fabrication of good project, the college is giving cash prize of Rs. 20,000/- to the students and 5000/- to the Faculty Guide for one best project per branch. All the projects made by the students are judged on their commercial utility.

CSI Regional Level Project Competition (North India) is organized in the college, in which many colleges from different states of North India participated. The Best Project Award was

given to Mr. Surya Mani Sharma of Dronacharya College of Engineering, Farrukhnagar which also got the second prize at the National Level Project Competition held at Udaipur.

5. <u>Collaboration with Various Companies</u>

To uplift the professional competence and to mitigate the gap between Industry Demand and University Curriculum the college signed various MOUs with top companies. IQAC played a critical role in starting of various centre of excellence and signing of MOUs. Some of the MOUs signed are:

- With TCS for Online Examination
- With ORACLE for Oracle IT Academy
- With Microsoft for Microsoft IT Academy and many more....

6. Seminar, Workshop & Various Bridge Courses

Many workshops, seminars and bridge courses are organized by various departments to make students more proficient in today's ever changing technical world. These workshops and bridge courses are organized with the help of the various imminent personalities from various industries.

7. National Social Service

- a) Blood donation camp is organized in the college.
- b) Participation in Run for obesity at Medanta
- c) Visit to Slum Areas at Farrukhnagar
- d) Rally on social issues.

8. Encouragement to girl education and help to poor and needy students

In order to encourage girl education, which is call of the day, the Management decided to award full fee concession to 15 girls on merit-cum-means basis.

9. Students' Achievement in Academics

University results improved considerably. In most of the subjects the pass percentage is more the 90%. In few departments, maximum numbers of students from the college are placed in the merit list declared by the University. Few of students are University toppers also.

10. Entrepreneurship Development

With an objective of encouraging the students to consider an option of becoming an entrepreneur, the college has established an Entrepreneurship Development Cell. The cell is organized by a team of faculty members and students. Seminars are conducted by the Entrepreneurship Development Cell in which various eminent speakers from industry, banks, Government are invited for their valuable suggestions.

11. Sports Facilities:-

Facilities for outdoor sports like Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Cricket and Badminton are available. Facilities for indoor sports like Chess, Carom, Table Tennis are available.
